A Bird Hits your Window & does not fly away immediately. What do you do?

-If it is bleeding, or appears clearly injured:



If it has no obvious injuries, but it is not flying:

Gently pick it up and place it in an unwaxed paper bag or a small box with something on the bottom so it is not slipping around. (tissue, paper towel, or washcloth)

Keep it in a quiet dark place, away from children, pets and loud noises so it can recuperate for about an hour or so.

Call us at 306-281-0554 and make arrangements to bring it in to rehabilitation as soon as possible. Keep it quiet in the meantime.



IF it CANNOT fly upwards, please gently return it to the bag or box and keep it safe & quiet. And call us.

-Test and see if it can fly after about an hour or so of rest: let it out of the bag or box in a small room where you can easily catch it again if it is not able to fly upwards.

IF it CAN fly up with ease, please gently catch it and take it outside where you can release it back where it belongs.

**NOTE: We also want to collect the birds that die as a result of hitting glass on a building.**
